

M007 Addition to 140 Bath Street

Introduction

John Honeyman's drawing submitted to the Glasgow Dean of Guild Court in early 1889 shows a single-storey addition to be constructed at 140 Bath Street. The fall of the site meant that the rear extension at ground-floor level would be supported on columns. The W. elevation was to be glazed along its entire length suggesting the new space was to be a drawing office. The date of the addition coincides with the beginning and subsequent expansion of the John Honeyman & Keppie partnership. O.S. maps show that the addition was built. 140 Bath Street and its neighbours were demolished in the early 1920s to make way for the expansion of the Pettigrew & Stephens department store. ¹

Job Book

The job books of Honeyman & Keppie (later Honeyman, Keppie & Mackintosh) are now held by The Hunterian, University of Glasgow and include four volumes related to the Mackintosh period. The books were used by the firm to keep a project-by-project, day-by-day record of contractors, suppliers and expenditure. The name of a project and/or client is usually at the top of the left-hand page, followed by information about tradesmen who tendered. The name of the measurer (quantity surveyor) is usually at the top of the right-hand page, followed by information about payments to contractors and suppliers. All of the data for M007 is entered in the tables below.

Page numbering is not consistent in the job books. Sometimes a single number refers to a double-page spread and sometimes each page is individually numbered. Here, each image of a double-page spread is identified by the number given at the top of the left-hand page.
