



# M237 Design for alterations to Overfield, Strathaven

## Introduction

Honeyman, Keppie & Mackintosh proposed to make alterations to water pipes and drains at this house near Strathaven, South Lanarkshire. No payments are recorded in the job book or cash book and it appears that the work was not carried out.

The business address of client, David Hamilton, a partner in a wine and whisky merchants at 102 Bath Street, was also included in the job-book entry.

**Authorship:** This is one of over 270 jobs carried out in the office of John Honeyman & Keppie (Honeyman, Keppie & Mackintosh from 1901) during Mackintosh's time there. Mackintosh undoubtedly worked on many of these, but there is no specific evidence for his involvement in this case.

**Cost from job book:** £139 15s 0d

**Status:** Presumably unbuilt

## Job Book

The job books of Honeyman & Keppie (later Honeyman, Keppie & Mackintosh) are now held by The Hunterian, University of Glasgow and include four volumes related to the Mackintosh period. The books were used by the firm to keep a project-by-project, day-by-day record of contractors, suppliers and expenditure. The name of a project and/or client is usually at the top of the left-hand page, followed by information about tradesmen who tendered. The name of the measurer (quantity surveyor) is usually at the top of the right-hand page, followed by information about payments to contractors and suppliers. All of the data for M237 is entered in the tables below.

Page numbering is not consistent in the job books. Sometimes a single number refers to a double-page spread and sometimes each page is individually numbered. Here, each image of a double-page spread is identified by the number given at the top of the left-hand page.
